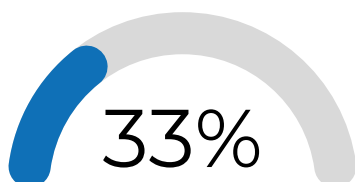

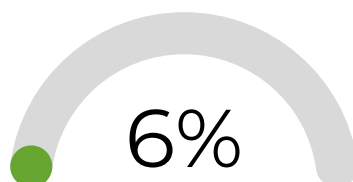

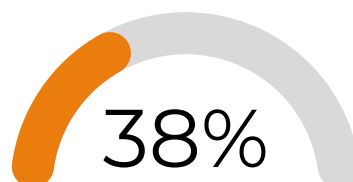
% of Uninsured Visits
